

*Euchromadora striata* (Eberth, 1863)  
(Fig. 59A)

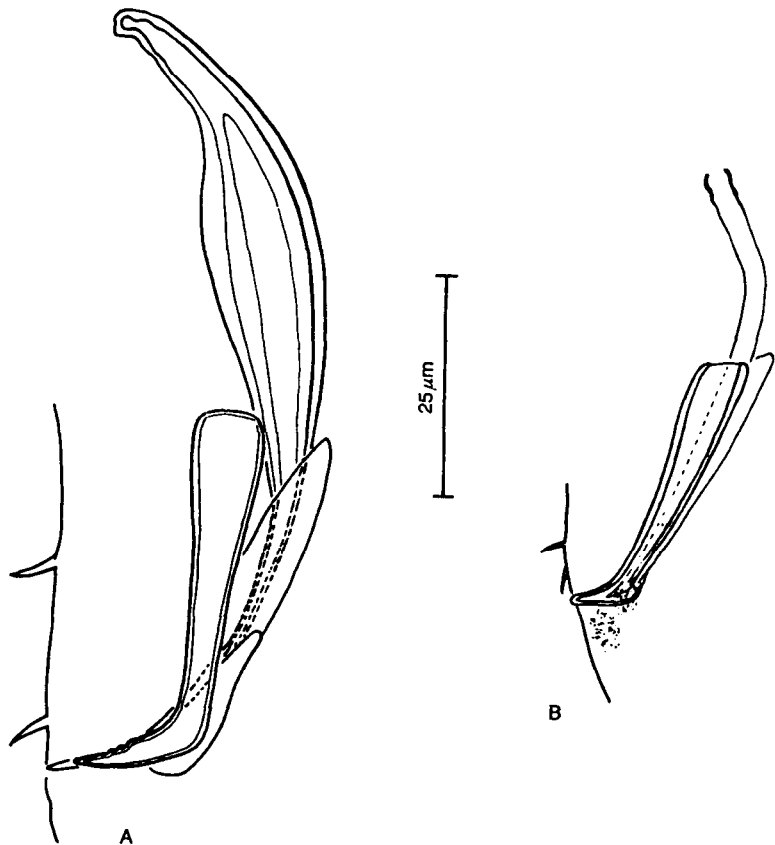


Fig. 59. *Euchromadora striata*. A, Spicules and gubernaculum. *Euchromadora gaulica*. B, Spicules and gubernaculum. From Coles (1965a).

*Description.* Body length 1.6–3.0 mm. Maximum diameter 60–130  $\mu\text{m}$  ( $a = 22\text{--}35$ ). Longer cephalic setae 12–15  $\mu\text{m}$ . Similar to *E. vulgaris* except that the spicules are equal in length (68–92  $\mu\text{m}$ ) and the telamons (32–47  $\mu\text{m}$ ) are a simple L-shape with no distinct swelling near the distal end but with the anterior margin of the distal limb serrated (Fig. 59A).

*Distribution.* Isles of Scilly; Looe, Cornwall, South West England; Littlehampton, Sussex, South East England; Skippers Island, Essex, South East England (intertidal seaweeds).
