


Fig. 210. Haliplectus wheeleri. A, Male tail, ventral view showing disposition of papillae; B, Male head; C, Male tail. From Coles (1965b).

Haliplectus wheeleri Coles, 1965b (Fig. 210)

Description (from Coles, 1965b). Body length 0.9-1.3 mm. Maximum diameter 42-50 μ m (a = 21-29). Cuticle with coarse striations. Amphids $4-5 \,\mu m$ (0.25 c.d.), about 1 h.d. posterior. Tail 1.5-2.1 a.b.d. Spicules $30-31 \,\mu\text{m}$ (1.1-1.2 a.b.d.), arcuate. Gubernaculum $11-12 \,\mu\text{m}$, straight. Five prominent papillae situated close together immediately anterior to claoca (Fig. 210C). Additional papillae arranged as in Fig. 210A. Vulva at 42-48% of body length.

Distribution. Skippers Island, Essex (intertidal mud).
