


Fig. 112. Nannolaimoides effilatus. A, Male head; B, Male tail; C, Cloacal region. From Boucher (1976).

Nannolaimoides effilatus (Boucher, 1976) comb. nov. (Fig. 112)

Description (from Boucher, 1976). Body length  $1.9-2.2 \,\mu\text{m}$  (a = 57-58).

Cuticle with transverse rows of fine punctations, alternate rows linked by transverse bars; lateral differentiation absent except in the post-anal conical region of the tail where a single lateral file of punctations is present. Six 6  $\mu$ m labial setae; ten cephalic setae, the longer six 12.5–15  $\mu$ m (0.5–0.6 h.d.). Amphids of 5.5 turns, 11–12  $\mu$ m (0.4 c.d.) wide. Buccal cavity with pointed dorsal tooth and two smaller subventral teeth. Tail 10–11 a.b.d. in male, 12 a.b.d. in female, conico-cylindrical with conical portion only 20% of total length.

Spicules  $50 \mu m$  (1.8 a.b.d.), thin at both ends and inflated in middle. Gubernaculum 25– $26 \mu m$ . Small precloacal spine and 10–14 precloacal supplements, apparently with cuticle ridges between them similar to *Pomponema*.

Distribution. Firth Clyde, West Scotland (intertidal sand).
