Paralinhomoeus pellucidus n. sp.

Locality and material. — South Georgia, St. 28: 12

Dimensions: L = 2,815 mm., α = 59,89, β = 18,77, γ = 22,99, V = 51,50 % Body slender, elongated, in its whole length of about even thickness. Cuticle smooth. Head rounded, light-yellow-gray coloured, with small, slender, submedian bristles. Buccal cavity typical. Oesophagus short, slender, and increasing posteriorly to a bulb, only very weakly demarcated from the remaining oesophagus, in a short distance (14 μ) before its middle surrounded by the nerve ring. Lateral organs situated far anteriorly, only 13,6—17 μ behind the front end, circular, in section 1/3 of the corresponding head diameter. Tail short, slender, conical, tapering gradually, posteriorly evidently swollen, its length 4,4 \times the anal body diameter.

Vulva about in the middle of the body. Female organs paired-symmetrical, with straigth, not reflexed ovaries.
