Siphonolaimus falklandiae n. sp.




Fig. 92. Siphonolaimus falklandiae n. sp. a. Anterior end, b. Tail and spicules, \times 450

Fig. 92 a-c

Locality and material. — Falkland Islands, Port Louis, Greenpatch: St. 42a, 233 Two exceedingly strongly wound males were present in the sample from Greenpatch.

Body of about even thickness in its total length. Cuticle thick and smooth. Head with submedian bristles, obliquely-truncate. Buccal cavity small and the "spear" in every respect typical of this genus. Lateral organs immediately behind the buccal cavity and rather large, circular. Ventral gland pore in a distance behind the spear equal to the distance front end—spear. Tail short, clumsy, cylindrical, posteriorly truncate, about as long as the anal body diameter. Spicules slender, curved. Accessory piece with a dorsally directed apophysis.

Unfortunately it was not possible to measure the strongly wound animals.

St. 42a. Falkland Islands. Port Louis: Greenpatch. Material shaked up from algae and kelp-rhizoids, cast up on shore by storm. 30. 7. 1902.

Number of species found: 54; Number of specimens found: 150.
