

The original name is:

Ameira longiremis var. *intermedia* Scott 1894

Full reference: Scott, T. 1894. Additions to the fauna of the Firth of Forth. Part III. 12th Annual Report of the Fishery Board for Scotland, 12(3): 231-271.

Not sure if the volume, number and pages range is ok. I've been trying to get a copy of that paper but it is not available in internet. Apparently, the description of the species appears in Scott (1894: 242, figs. 6-14).

Sars (1920: 60) gave the subspecies full species rank as: *Parameira intermedia* (Scott).

Wilson (1925:64) noted that the generic name *Parameira* Sars was preoccupied and changed it for *Sarsameira*.

Lang (1948: 851) noted that Scott's *Parameira intermedia* was identical to *Sarsameira parva* (Boeck, 1872) and re-named Scott's *Parameira intermedia* as *Sarsameira sarsi*.

I'm not sure if "Lang, 1936" (1935?) is the correct author for *Sarsameira sarsi*. In his 1935 paper, he (Lang, 1935: 9-10) only included *A. longiremis* into his *Sarsameira*-group. Lang (1948: 851) explicitly changed the name of the species for *Sarsameira sarsi*.
