Πούς = foot.

Carapace broad, produced backwards laterally. First antennae very small, 2-jointed. 3 pairs of dorsal plates, the first placed laterally, the second small and central, the third large lateral and spreading. Gen. segt. as large as the cephalothorax; abdomen small, hidden.

Swimming legs rudimentary, rami of 1st. and 2nd. pairs 2-jointed, the others 1-jointed. Male unknown.
