

SIPHONOSTOMATOIDA

TANYPLEURIDAE KABATA, 1969

Tanypleurus-Raffray-Insects-1890

Tanypleurus = long-sided, huge.

Body flattened, very wide, produced on either side into a digitate process like an elk's horn, but bent around ventrally.

Fastened to its host by means of a short peduncle, cornaceous, simple or double, sending out a cirrous disk of attachment, and itself coming from anterior margin "body."

Egg-sacs bent & partially concealed -
Mxpds, & thorax legs entirely wanting.

Male unknown
