A New Form of Fresh-water Sponge.—A note was read from Mr. Edw. Ports, reporting the discovery in Chester Creek of another curious form of fresh-water sponge, a third species of Carterella, resembling C. tubisperma in the character of its birotulates and the length of its foraminal tubes, but much more robust than that species. The tendrils are nearly as long as those of C. tenosperma, but broad, flat and ribband-like.

Thus far it is the most conspicuous and peculiar of our American forms. He proposed for it the name Carterella latitenta.
